Detailed provisions in relation to membership have been established under Article 58 [2][b] as follows:

- 1. for all membership under Articles 11[1] and 11[2] the membership year shall commence on 1 November;

- 3. members first joining after 29 April 2016 and paying the subscription due before 31 October 2016 shall be deemed to be members until 31 October 2017;
- 4. members first joining between 1 May and 31 October in 2017 and any later year shall be deemed to be members until 31 October of the following year;
- 5. additional adult, additional senior and family members other than the first-named shall not be entitled to separate notification of meetings;
